

SIXTH RINGING REPORT

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In my Fifth Report (*The Ostrich* 1956), optimistically labelled Part I, I had hoped to issue a further report at an early date, covering ringing done up to the end of June 1954, and summarising retrapping returns up to the same date. Unfortunately, this proved impracticable as so many participants' returns were delayed: even now (2 Sept. 1956), several are still outstanding, but as they will account for only a small part of ringing done, further delay would be unjustified. Fortunately however, the records that are available have been brought right up to date, so this report will cover ringing up to 30 June 1956 as well as all recoveries that have been reported and for which complete details are available.

RINGS USED. The ringing scheme has grown rapidly during the three years since the last figures were given (*The Ostrich* 1954: 130), as the following table shows:

Schedule "A" gives details of ringers who have ringed over 100 birds in any one year. The drop in the Cape Bird Club figures is due partly to the separation of the Rondevlei Bird Sanctuary figures since 1 Jan. 1955 and partly to cessation of gannet ringing.

This schedule clearly shows how much is due to various Bird Clubs. It is pleasing to be able to welcome new ones to the list, namely the Natal Bird Club, the Natal Wild Life Protection Society, the Eastern Cape Wild Bird Society and the Pretoria Bird Club. Tribute should be paid to the magnificent energy and achievements of the Witwatersrand Bird Club and to the fine, steady output of Rondevlei. It is also a pleasure to draw attention to the Transvaal Provincial Administration's progressiveness in establishing the Barberspan Bird Research Station, which has rapidly come to the forefront as a permanent ringing station.

A most encouraging feature is the way ringers are beginning to complement one another's work. The most notable example is the recovery by Barberspan Research Station of a Red-billed Teal ringed at Rondevlei. Widely separated people are also ringing the same species and so enable a spread to be obtained which will enhance the value of recoveries. For instance, Cattle Egrets are being ringed at the Cape (Rondevlei), in the Southern Transvaal (WBC) and in Natal (Natal Wild Life Protection Society), waterfowl and waders in the Cape (Rondevlei) Southern and Western Transvaal (WBC and Barberspan); queleas in Tanganyika (Govt.), Southern Rhodesia (Ashton, Plowes and Smithers, with Govt. help), Transvaal and Orange Free State (WBC and Union Govt.) and probably this year Bechuanaland Protectorate (Govt.) Gannets were ringed one year by the C.B.C. at Malgas Is. and the Eastern Cape at Bird Is., with interesting results.

As the above table shows, large numbers of species have been covered. The total number since the scheme began is 364. This is a fantastic number.

As mentioned in earlier reports, there are many cases where too few birds have been ringed to produce any significant results. In the early days, it was necessary to give ringers the widest latitude in order to encourage their participation. But this phase has now passed and the stage has been reached where ringers should be more discriminating and should refrain from ringing odd birds, that chance brings to hand, whose recovery is extremely unlikely and would in any event be of little value, even if it did occur.

Schedule "B" gives a complete list of species and numbers ringed during the past three years. There is a growing number of species being ringed in really significant numbers. There are five cases where over 1,000 birds have been ringed in a year, and there are several others where the aggregate totals over several years exceed this figure. The most noteworthy examples are gannets, herons, egrets, ducks, vultures, coots, doves, swifts, swallows, sparrows and weavers. Among the latter, the ringing of queleas has been outstanding. Cases where the ringing is mainly confined to one centre are those of wagtails, European Starlings and Little Stints at Rondevlei; spoonbill, vultures, Cliff Swallows in the Southern Transvaal. Large numbers of non-migrants such as doves and Cape Sparrows are being ringed at Rondevlei and Johannesburg.

Schedule "C" gives details of recoveries, excluding those where the birds were found—dead or alive—near where and soon after they were ringed. Retrappings are excluded and will be dealt with in a subsequent report.

The recovery rates, excluding retrappings at or near original ringing points, are very low. Those for 10 species are given below, totals in round numbers.

The rate for all birds ringed since the scheme's inception in 1948, totalling about 88,500, is 0.6 (recovery total 560). Considering the vast distances covered by the scheme—the two areas furthest apart, Rondevlei and Nyamandlhovu, if we exclude Tanganyika which is another 1,300 miles away, are 1,200 miles from one another—the sparseness of many of the areas' population, and the backwardness of so large a part of the population, these figures are not surprising. As might be expected, the larger birds have the highest recovery rates, e.g. gannets, vultures, spoonbill and coot—the latter also frequenting the better watered areas and therefore the more densely populated. Ducks and geese have the highest rate: again this is to be expected as they are the most likely

to be recovered through shooting. It is probable that their rate will tend to become higher still as it is only in the past year that they have been ringed in appreciable numbers (about 2,000 in 1955/56).

This Progress report is, as in the past, a record of raw facts and not an analysis of the significance of the recoveries that have been made. Attention is however drawn to some of the most interesting ones.

GANNETS. So far, birds other than birds of the year have only rarely been found on the west coast far from their breeding ground. This year there have been three; 536: 01506 and 536: 06941 both ringed Bird Is. 25 Mar. 1954 recovered at Benguella on 20 April and 7 March the following year, and 536: 03119 ringed on 25 Feb. 1954 recovered on 3 June 1956 between Pointe Noire and Mayemba.

Apart from these, no further recoveries of 4,000 birds ringed at Bird Is. in 1954 are reported this year. So, too, there are only two of a similar number (3,997) ringed at Malgas that same season (Feb. 1954) whereas there are over 10 recoveries during this period from the 4,585 gannets ringed (mostly as adults) the previous season. Whether this has any significance only time and further research will show.

CORMORANTS. The diametrically opposite movement of two young White-breasted Cormorants fledged at Barberspan is shown.

CATTLE EGRETS. Most recoveries were less than 100 miles from the breeding grounds but the following are exceptional:

NIGHT HERON. 524:2718 Rondevlei 9/2/55 recov. Palmeira 7/5/55 1070 miles N.E.

SACRED IBIS. Two more birds were recovered in N. Rhodesia. One of them 525:4471 was found by the same person who found one two years before (almost to the day) in the same place, i.e. A 737 reported in *The Ostrich* 1956, : 11.

AFRICAN SPOONBILL. 525:2350 was found 430 miles S.S.W. of its breeding ground at Benoni.

DUCKS AND GEESE. Thanks to the work being done at Barberspan many valuable records are being made. The long distances travelled by Redbilled Teal as compared with Yellowbill Duck (both of which were ringed in quantity) are noticeable. One Cape Shoveller and one Pochard also travelled far—650 miles. The first recovery of one of the very few ringed as juvenile was made—Red-billed Teal 524:2417 ringed 21/5/54 at Wankie Game Reserve recovered the Cunene River 860 miles W.

CAPE VULTURE. Three birds ringed in their nest were found far from their nesting place in the Magaliesberg, one 340 miles, another 400 miles and the third 480 miles. All including two others found some little distance away, were on the south side.

COOT. For the second time a bird was found over 200 miles from where originally ringed, this time at George, 230 miles East of Rondevlei.

CLIFF SWALLOW. For the second time a recovery was made in the Congo of a bird ringed in the Southern Transvaal.

QUELEA. Several long distance recoveries were made e.g.:

For the first time, nestlings have been ringed thus giving the starting point of these birds.

An appeal is once more made to all finders to send the ring with their report, if possible and so help minimise the risk of mistakes being made.

The standard of record keeping by ringers has greatly improved. Unfortunately it is still not yet perfect and over a dozen recoveries cannot be used as there is insufficient detail about the original use of the ring. A few cases have occurred of palpably faulty identification of the bird being ringed. Participants are again earnestly asked not to ring a bird unless they are absolutely sure what it is.

The Society's thanks are due to the Officer Commanding the Criminal Investigation Dept., Bulawayo for the examination of the numbers on damaged rings and to Dr. Bigalke and his staff at the zoo, Pretoria for their magnificent co-operation in dealing with recoveries notified to them. As these records show, their work is considerable but they have always been efficiency and courteousness personified.

This is my last general report. The scheme has now grown too big and its potential contribution to S. African ornithology is too important for it to be left to the desultory sparetime attention of a private individual. I am therefore delighted to announce that it has found a home—which I hope will be permanent—with Dr. G. McLachlan in the Port Elizabeth Museum. In bidding it farewell, I would like to thank all those who have participated in the scheme for their unfailing help and for their enthusiasm. Their keenness has been infectious and has made my association with this branch of the Society the source of considerable pleasure.
