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BIRD RINGING REPORT FOR JULY 2006 TO DECEMBER 2013

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
The previous report (46th) to summarise the ringing effort in southern Africa was published nearly ten years ago in Afring News volume 35 (2006) and summarised the July 2004-June 2005 ringing records. Since then the database has grown from 1,740,002 to 2,380,931 records. This report covers 8.5 years (the period July 2006 to December 2013), and future reports will cover calendar years.

Ringing effort

Between 1 July 2005 to 31 December 2013 SAFRING received 661988 records (594075 ringing records; 65019 retraps; 2554 recoveries of 1280 species) (Figure 1). The most prolific year over this time was 2010 where 91472 records (82584 ringing records; 8622 retraps; 266 recoveries of 872 species) were received. Ringing effort has decreased since then with only 64722 records (56709 ringing records; 7732 retraps; 281 recoveries of 692 species) being received in 2013.

Ringing effort by region

The effort from ringers was well distributed across southern Africa, with most records (ringing, retrap, recovery) originating from South Africa and Namibia (Table 1). The South African province to produce the most records over this period was the Western Cape (95670 records), while the province in which the most species were ringed was KwaZulu-Natal (Table 1).

Ringing effort by ringers

During the review period there were 462 active registered ringers/groups submitting data with only 252 ringers capturing over 100 birds and 123 of these ringers caught more than 1000 birds (Table 2). Most of these ringers ringed a variety of species which were distributed across southern Africa.

The top ringer for this period was Mr Bennie van den Brink who ringed the most birds (27988 birds), while the individual that ringed the most species was Dr Ursula Franke (371 species) (Table 2).

DEA (Department of Environmental Affairs) is gradually ringing less seabirds every year.

Ringing effort by species

Of all the records received during this period, most belonged to terrestrial species ringed by citizen scientists (Table 3). A fair number of oceanic species were ringed on islands, such as Marion and Gough, where many researchers are based, as well as DEA employees.

Recoveries

For the 2005 to 2014 ringing period SAFRING received 2554 recovery records, which were largely sent from the general public. These records were received from various locations around Africa and worldwide. The species most recovered were the Cape Gannets and Kelp Gulls. These were found on beaches and it was not possible to verify a cause. The remainder of the documented causes of death were due to collisions with either motor vehicles or buildings, and deaths as a result of domestic/wild animals (Table 4). Some interesting recoveries are given in Table 5.
