

APPLICATIONS FOR
FREE RINGS AND SAFRING RESEARCH GRANTS

Amateur ringers with registered projects may make application for free ring issues to SAFRING. Such applications are considered by the Technical Sub-Committee which meets in June each year.

Free ring issues are valid for a July/June ringing year and applications for the 1983/1984 ringing year should be submitted to arrive at SAFRING by 1st June 1983. Applications, which need be no longer than a single A4 page, should give details of the project (title, objectives, when commenced, proposed duration), the number of birds ringed so far, and the number and types of rings required for the coming year.

SAFRING research grants are funded by the C.S.I.R. and any registered ringer resident in the Republic or S.W.Africa/Namibia can obtain application forms from the Ringing Organiser. Such grants are issued for a calendar year and may not exceed R700. Successful applicants are required to submit a detailed project report once annually. Applications for 1984 must be submitted to the Ringing Organiser by 1st June 1983.
