Analysis of ringing records at Witsand H. Dieter Oschadleus & Les G. Underhill

RAINFALL

The Northern Cape had experienced its heaviest rainfall for many years. The average annual rainfall in the Witsand Nature Reserve is 285 mm: Table I shows monthly rainfall since January 2000, and the annual rainfall since 1994.

GENERAL STATISTICS

A total of 2656 birds were ringed over the period 4-12 March 2000 during the Ringers' Training Course (Table 2). Most birds were ringed at or near Witsand (2832S 2228E to 2834S 2229E). The Sociable Weavers and Redbilled Queleas in the 'Elsewhere' column were ringed on farms neighbouring Witsand. The most ringed species at or near Witsand were Sociable Weavers (867), Red Bishops (245) and Redbilled Quelca (131). The former was ringed at several colonies, while the latter two species were roosting at Pepler's Hole in the dunes. The most frequently ringed species at Ou Murasie Farm on the Orange River (2852S 2201E) were Cape White-eyes (344) and Masked Weavers (79).

Some of the raptors were ringed en route to or from Witsand, and were trapped at varying distances from the reserve. The plovers and stilts were ringed at Pudu Dam (2748S 2243E), west of Sishen. Nocturnal trips resulted in owls and a nightjar being trapped.

There were 176 retraps, including birds retrapped on the same day, but not all ringers recorded retraps. The highest retrap percentages are for Red Bishop (23%) and Whitebrowed Sparrowweaver (20%). Not much can be obtained from the retrap data except for the Red Bishops at Pepler's Hole. On 6 March 188 Red Bishops were ringed. On 8 March 56 new Red Bishops were ringed and 60 were retrapped. The total population can thus be estimated from the Lincoln Index at N = (188 * 116)/60 = 363 birds.

Two birds have been recovered since the workshop. Cape Wagtail BB27359 was shot on 21 March on a nearby farm and Longbilled Crombec AE45628 drowned in a trough at the Jessnitz' house on 10 September 2000.

SYNCHRONISATION OF MOULT

The core of the range of the Sociable Weaver *Philetairus socius* lies in the Northern Cape, extending into Namibia and southwestern Botswana (ASAB2 534–535). The Witsand Nature Reserve lies near the southern limit of the range, and there were many active colonial nests in the reserve and adjoining farms. There are three Sociable Weaver colonies inside Witsand, and three on two neighbouring farms, where ringing occurred. Mistnetting was undertaken at 6 nests, and 659 birds were caught and measured, and a fur-

ther 208 birds were captured incidently. mainly at waterholes.

Over the first week in March, most Sociable Weavers (adults and juveniles) were moulting the sixth primary feather (n = 116), with a range from the third to ninth primary. Five of the six colonies were closely synchronised, with mean moult scores for adults ranging between 23.4 and 25.7 (Table 3); this means that these colonies were at the same stage of moult to about one-fifth of a primary. One colony had a mean moult score of 20.0 which means that it was lagging behind the other colonies by almost one primary feather.

Similarly, most Whitebrowed Sparrowweavers were moulting the sixth primary feather (n = 24), with a range from the fourth to eighth primary.

TRAPPING A KORI BUSTARD WITH A TORCH AND HANDNET

On 12 March, the last day of the Witsand Ringing Workshop, Gareth Hazell and I were on our way to the Padkloof ringing site when we saw a Kori Bustard walking in front of us on the road. Since it was still very dark we decided to take our chances with catching the bird: 'we will never know if we don't try!'

I walked next to the car while Gareth slowly drove towards the bird. At this stage the Bustard was in the long grass next to the road. I switched on my little torch and Gareth switched off his bakkie's main lights. I walked slowly towards the big bird shining the light straight in its eyes with the handnet in my other hand. Surprisingly, when I was about two metres from the bird it started walking slowly towards me.

When we were about one metre apart I put the net over the bird and at the same time grabbed its sides to prevent the bird from opening its wings. The bird struggled a bit. So there I was on my knees holding on to the bird and trying to get Gareth's attention to come and help so the Bustard would not tear Gareth's net. After about 10 seconds which felt like an hour Gareth popped out of the bakkie and asked: 'Have you got it?' (he couldn't see me because the bakkie's nose was elevated due to a pile of sand next to the road), 'Yes, I've got it, come and help me!'

We managed to get the bird safely out of the net, took it to the car and laid it on its back on the table. After ringing it with a 19 mm ring, we released the bird and it walked off slowly as if nothing had happened. It let go a huge 'bollie' as it walked away. Luckily the bird kept it in while we were ringing it. We drove on, forgetting to put the table back in the bakkie due to all the excitement. Imagine the next person's reaction to seeing a table in the middle of the road with not a soul in sight! Well, someone scored a table!
