

KEEPING COMPARTMENTS AS USED IN ENGLAND
IN CONNECTION WITH CANNON NETTING

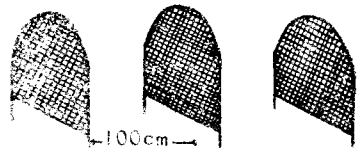
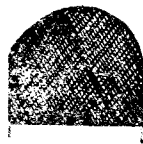
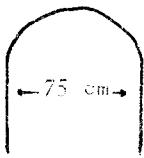

These compartments have successfully been used by some members of the Cape Wader Group for mistnet outings. Taking up little space in transport, they nevertheless provide you with a generous keeping area. They are light and easily erected within a matter of minutes. The birds are in contact with the ground thus promoting a temperature exchange. They are also more hygienic.

Anyone able to thread a needle could successfully tackly this ringing aid.

MATERIAL NEEDED: Galvanised wire, as used for fences, hessian or sacking or any other airtransmitting material

1. Bent wire
2. Sew hessian in between
3. Space out to the desired compartment length



4. Cover with hessian and make a slot along the top just long enough to make for easy transfer of the birds.
